CISA Community involved in sustaining agriculture Senior FarmShare

CISA's Senior FarmShare program provides lowincome seniors with ten weeks of farm fresh vegetables purchased directly from local farms.

Eligible seniors sign up in the spring to receive weekly shares of freshly harvested local produce, distributed through senior service agencies throughout Franklin, Hampshire, and Hampden counties. Seniors commit to the program for the duration, and pay a cost share of one dollar per week, in exchange for ten weeks of produce valued at \$145.

In 2023, Senior FarmShare will serve 700 low-income seniors through 19 distribution sites and 15 farms. Since 2004, Senior FarmShare has distributed over 7,000 season-long shares and paid \$814,700 to local farms for their produce.

At the end of the 2022 season:

94% of those surveyed said Senior FarmShare had a positive impact on their diet and increased the amount of fresh vegetables and fruit they ate.
